The seminar will be conducted in two phases. The first phase is designed to provide an overview of conceptual approaches to the study of international security. Students are to come to class having done a careful reading of several of the assigned materials for each week; for any THREE of these weeks, they are to turn in a book-review-style essay synthesizing and criticizing two or three of the readings in the week's topical section.

The second phase will then entail students' presentations of their specific seminar research paper topics.

The course grade will be based on the review essays (one-third) and the research paper (two-thirds), taking into account also the seminar discussions.
