The scholarship will be awarded to a graduate student whose primary career interest is providing speech-language services to children in the school setting and who has completed an exemplary project related to speech-language pathology in the schools as part of the course requirement in their academic program. The project may have been completed as part of a course, clinical practicum, research project, extern project or paper on topics such as service delivery models in the schools, treatment of a particular population or age group seen in the schools, collaboration with educators, or evidence-based practice. The submission must describe how the project advances and improves services in schools.

To be eligible, applicants must be enrolled in an accredited master's program in Speech-Language Pathology.

The award consists of a \$3,000, scholarship to be used for educational & clinical expenses (e.g., books, clinical materials or equipment, tuition or other expenses related to their educational program).

### How to Apply

**Submit by January 30, 2009.** *Applications for this scholarship opportunity must include the following:*

1. Completion of a candidate information form that provides demographic and contact information as well as a description of the student's interest in and future goals related to school-based speech-language pathology.
2. An abstract and brief summary (1,500 word maximum) of a project related to school-based speech-language pathology service provision. The summary should include a detailed description of the project's actual or potential promise for advancing and improving the provision of services in the schools. Projects must be completed during the 2008 calendar year.
3. A recommendation form completed by a faculty member or administrator.
