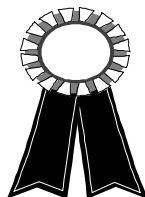

### UMUC Course Named "Best" by Maryland Distance Learning Association

UMUC's online LIBS 150 Information Literacy and Research Methods course was named the 2001–2002 Best Distance Course by the Maryland Distance Learning Association (MDLA), an association of learning professionals who advocate and promote distance learning in Maryland.

LIBS 150 is a one-credit course that teaches students how to properly find information on the Internet, conduct effective research, cite resources properly, and learn strategies for avoiding plagiarism. The course was launched in fall 2001 and is now a requirement for all UMUC undergraduate students who have declared majors.

"While it is clear that our library and information services are exemplary in enabling more than 78,000 UMUC students worldwide to access the university's online library services, even that is not enough," said Mary Ellen Hrutka, dean of UMUC's School of Undergraduate Studies. "Students must be taught to identify, evaluate, and use information, and they must demonstrate a basic level of proficiency in using these resources before they can move forward in their programs of study at UMUC. These skills are essential for ongoing academic success."
