



Marc H. Morial, Esq. is President and Chief Executive Officer of the National Urban League. In a distinguished professional career that has spanned 25 years, Marc Morial has performed his roles of entrepreneur, lawyer, professor, legislator, mayor, and President of U.S. Conference of Mayors with excellence. He is considered one of the most accomplished servant-leaders in the nation.



Dr. Robert M. Groves is the Director of the United States Census Bureau, a sociologist, and research professor in survey methodology at both the University of Michigan and University of Maryland, College Park. He was an associate director and later a visiting researcher at the Census Bureau from 1990 to 1992, and he has published several books on statistical sampling.



Dr. Julianne Malveaux is the 15th President of Bennett College for Women. She is also an economist, author and commentator. Dr. Malveaux's contributions to the public dialogue on issues such as race, culture, gender, and their economic impacts, are shaping public opinion in 21st century America.



Dr. Odis Johnson, Jr. is an Assistant Professor in African American Studies, and Faculty Associate at the Maryland Population Research Center at the University of Maryland. Dr. Johnson's areas of expertise include social policy, urban neighborhoods and the educational development of African American youths. His research appears in the nation's leading scientific journals, including the *Review of Educational Research* and the *Urban Review*.
